

Short Bio: Dennis Brandt aka "Whoretense" has been making art since I can remember. In kindergarten I was punished for making to much noise during finger painting. I sold drawings to a friend in the third grade (1972). Those early works showed much promise for a stellar career in art. Then for various reasons I became an engineer.

Whatever else I do, all these modes of visual art are not just fun, but vital to my sanity. Lately I have been enjoying making things of beauty for their own sake, in that they can be understood universally; in these times of unrest, raw organic works offer a bit of quiet, or welcome innocence if you like.

My work is varied and nebulous and seems reluctant to commit to a single medium, as yet. I've been repairing and rebuilding toys and other objects for some time for the shear joy in 're-animating' them. I've done many air brush works over the years. I am also drawn to watercolor these days because it is so challenging, and because there is this endless potential I'm only beginning to tap. In addition I've been painting an image of "Saint" Bob Ross, with a suitable landscape background, on our garage door for fun.

I love the contrast inherent in a setting, be that intentional or accidental. I love the contrasts generally required in virtually all composition. My best work is an exploration of the relationship between the conventional and the unexpected; the historic and the contemporary; the peaceful, or violent, or ironic, or controversial. Through shift in scale, color, context, whatever it takes-- my representational compositions and related works all attempt to highlight aspects of their source, creating a new relationship between the things I want to emphasize, and the things I want to ignore.

Short Bio: Despite being born into a repressive communist regime, Magdalena Cooney was destined to become a painter. Growing up in a children's puppet theatre, her parents provided a magical cocoon, creating an alternate world marked by whimsy, fantasy and larger-than-life characters. Self-taught Cooney credits her parents and their cadre of artist friends as her first and most important teachers. Her father, a set designer and puppet maker, and her mother, a graphic designer, influenced Cooney's ability to create amidst a culture of censorship. The theatre was always Cooney's "happy place," and she believes it is the reason her paintings lean towards the evocative, non-objective rather than specific. From an early age, Cooney was acutely aware of the competing forces of dark and light at play in her life. These contrasts are apparent in the opposing hues seen in many of Cooney's paintings. Her choice of color palettes also reflects her two homes; one echoes the famous red and orange rooftops of her birthplace, Czechoslovakia (now the Czech Republic), and the other is inspired by the cool grey and blue tones of her current home in Seattle, Washington. The contrast in colors moves through Cooney's paintings as she expertly blends and layers to create fascinating, sensual swirls of emotion and texture. In her latest experimentation, Cooney uses unusual painting tools to create her large canvases for a complex textured look. Not interested in shock value, Cooney says her paintings feel like home, a place in your heart that is precious and where you feel most like yourself.



Short Bio: Hailing from the Midwest, Scott Filipiak, graduated from art school with a degree in Commercial Art/Graphic Design spring boarding his award-winning 20+ year career in graphic design/art direction.

Upon moving to Utah in 2009, Scott went back to his roots of painting and photography and has shown in multiple galleries including the Springville Museum of Art, the Urban Arts Gallery and the Finch Lane Gallery. Scott has won numerous awards and continues to explore ideas inspired by the natural beauty of the West.

The barcode series developed out of Scott's photography. He saw a group of aspen trees that reminded him of a barcode's tightly grouped, vertical lines. Scott combined his love of technology and painting to create a working barcode that could be scanned using a free QR Reader app but could also stand alone as a work of art. Most recently he has also started incorporating near field communication (NFC) circuits into his work to further expand the digital connectivity of his work.

Scott's barcodes often lead to chainsaws and axes in an ironic symbolization that often we are destroyed by that which creates us and the hidden fear of self-destruction. He has had numerous work juried into shows including the President's Show in Salt Lake City, the Springville Museum of Arts' Spring Salon and the Springville Museum of Art Spiritual and Religious Show.

He is currently showing his work at galleries in Utah, Idaho and Washington.
